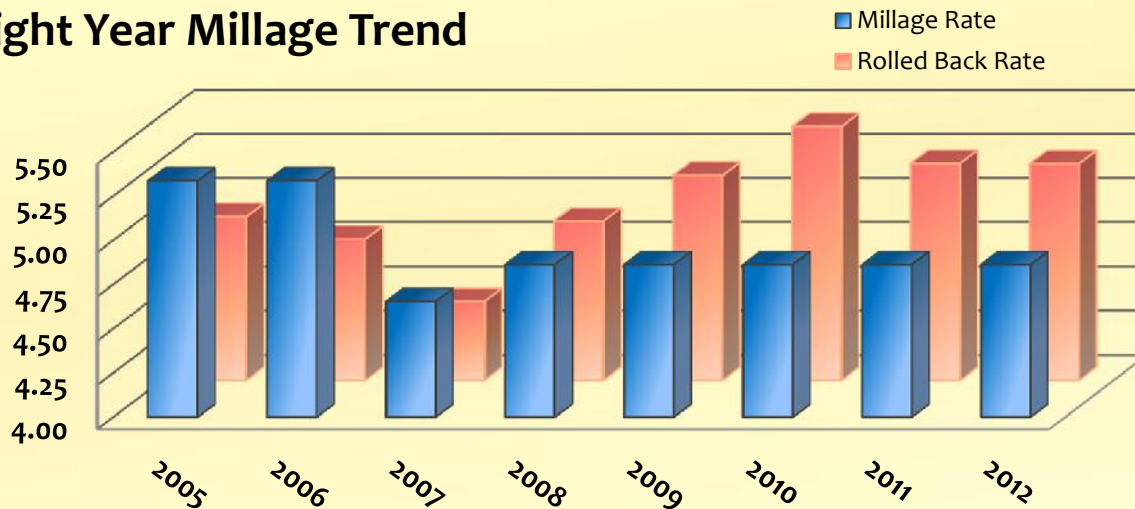

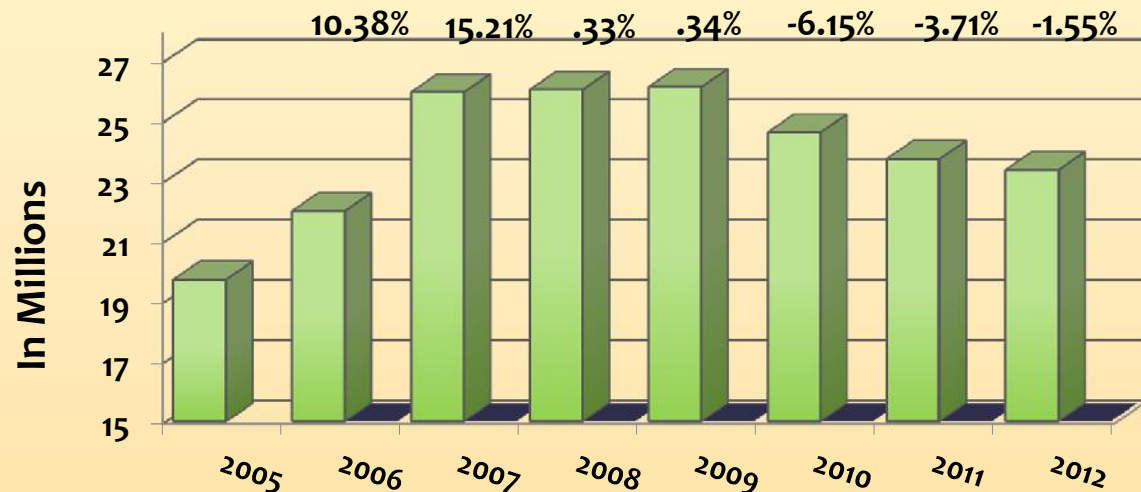
Eight Year Millage Trend

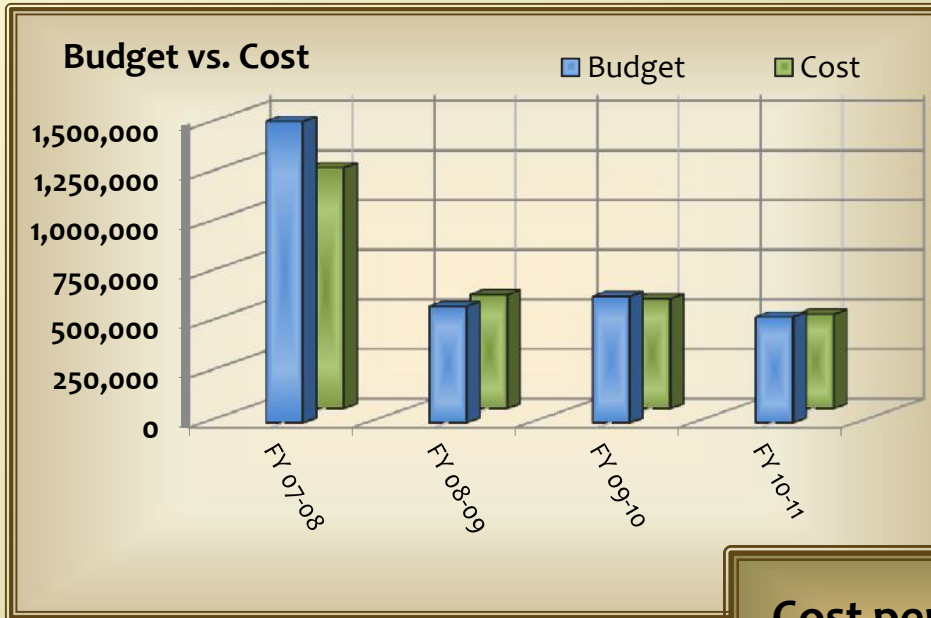
The City revised the Land Development Code regarding signage on December 5, 2011.

The new revisions :

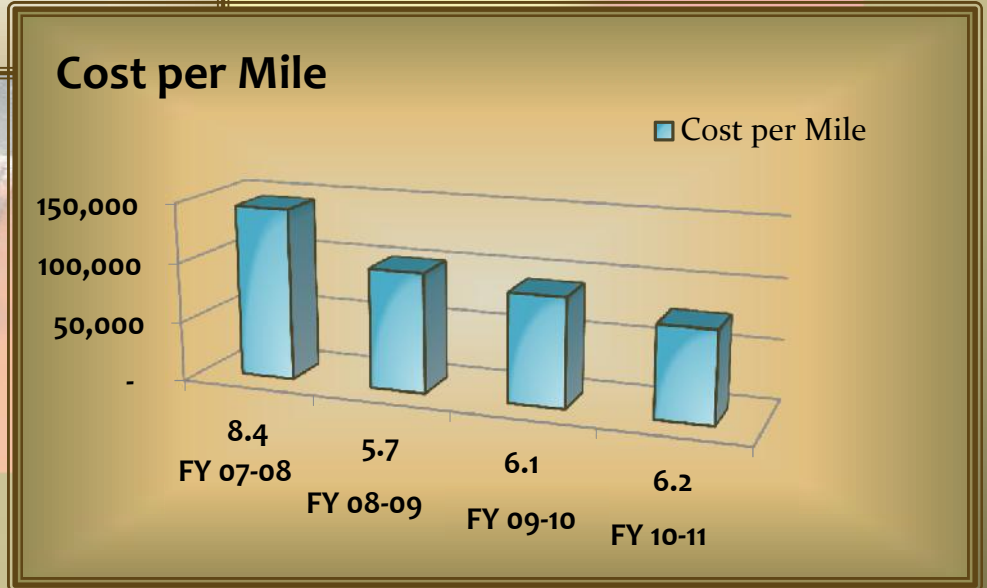
- Make the LDC more Business Friendly
- Reformat Article XIV Signs to read easier
- Increased the maximum area of signs
- Create new types of signs and established standards and definitions
- **Added an Attention Getting device program to allow businesses to advertise special events with attention getting devices such as large balloons, tents, wavy hands, sign wavers etc.**



The Road Ahead, literally!

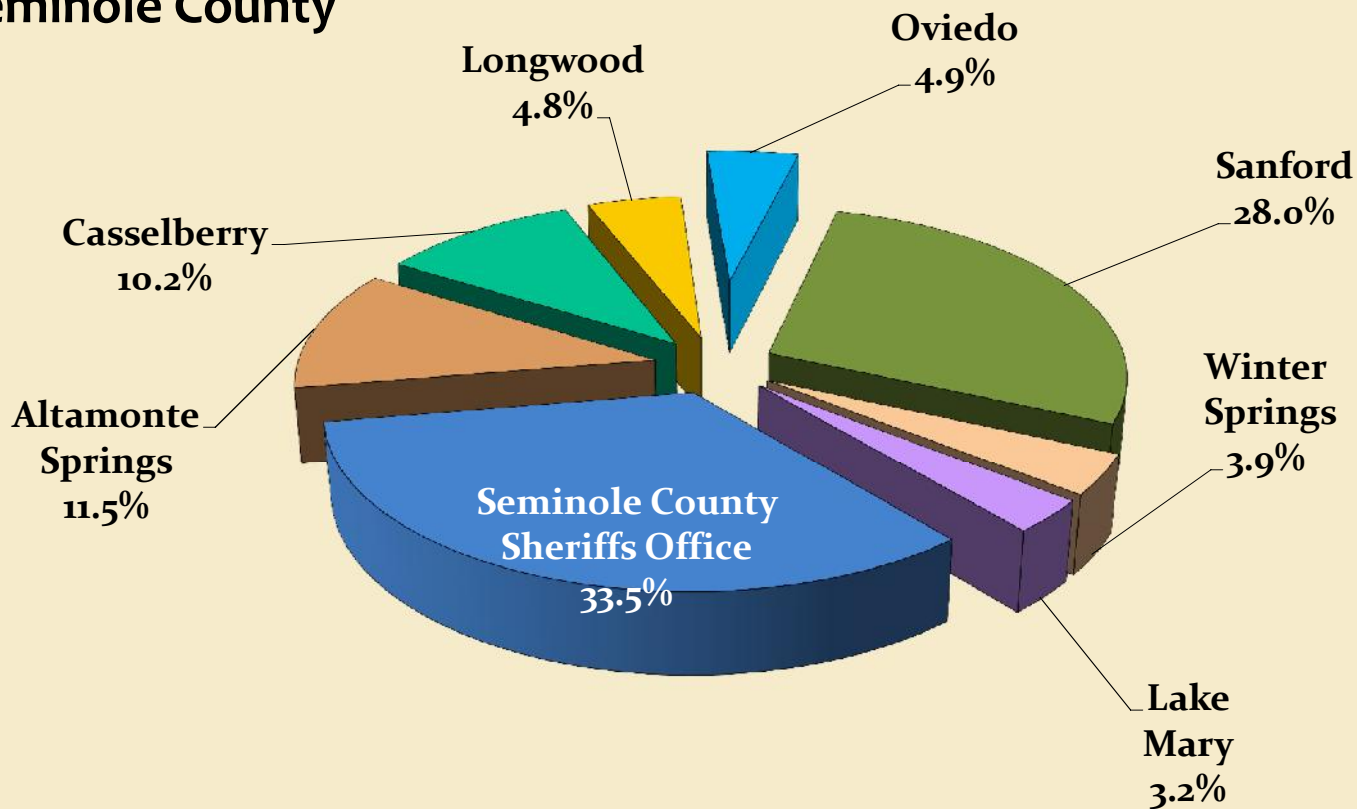


Approximately 28 miles of the City's 250 Lane Miles is anticipated to be resurfaced at a cost of about 2.4 million in the next 5 years.

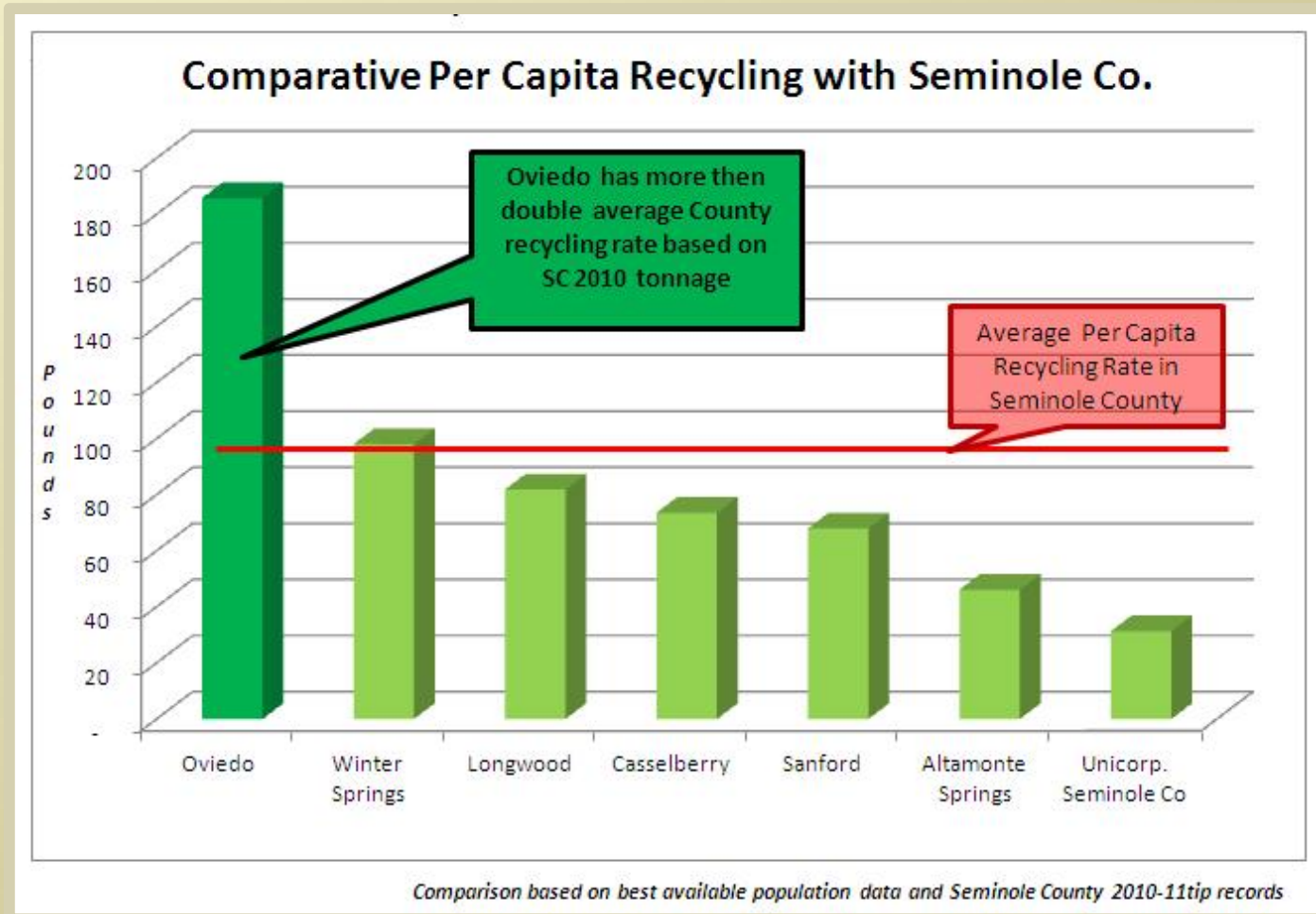


Oviedo Crime Rate, Jan- June 2011 down **-13.8%**!

It's Easy Being Green: Oviedo Leads Seminole County with Highest Recycling Rate

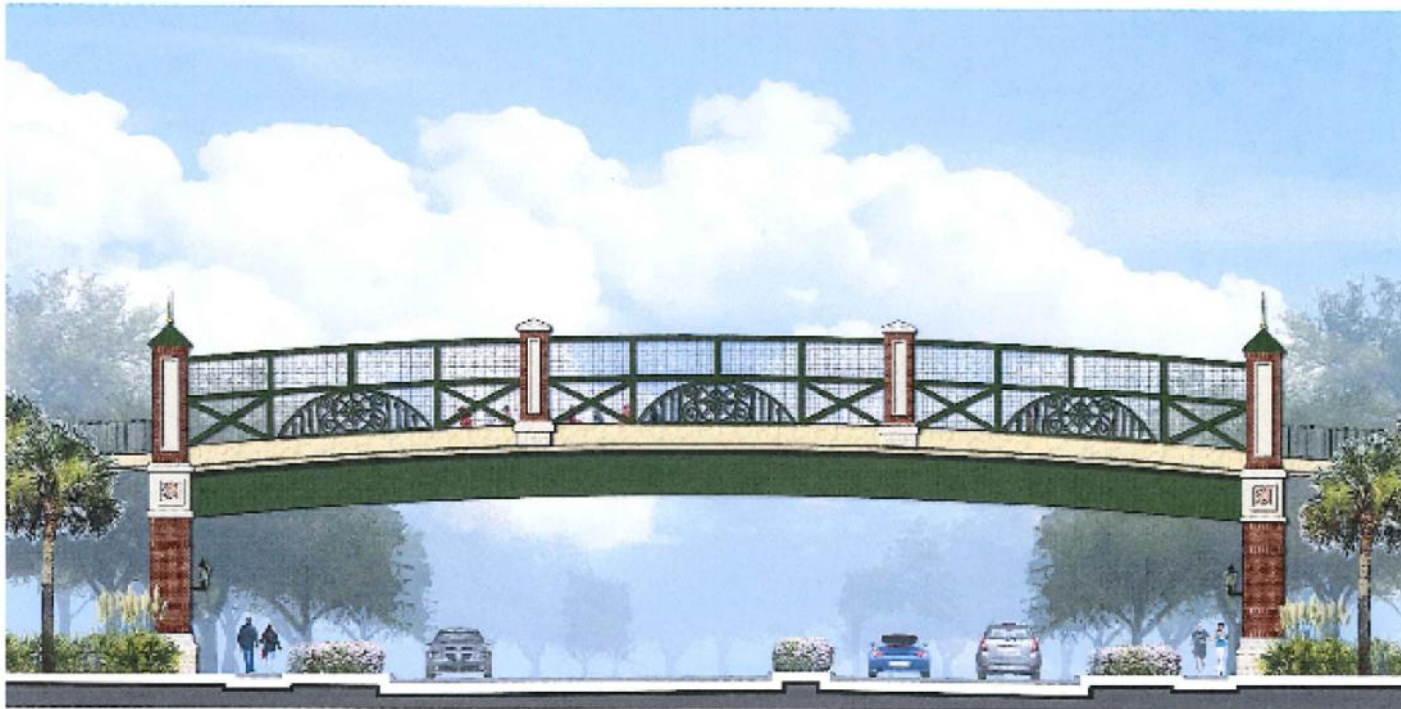


Seminole Trail Overpass on Red Bug Lake Road



Red Bug Lake Road Pedestrian Overpass Beautification

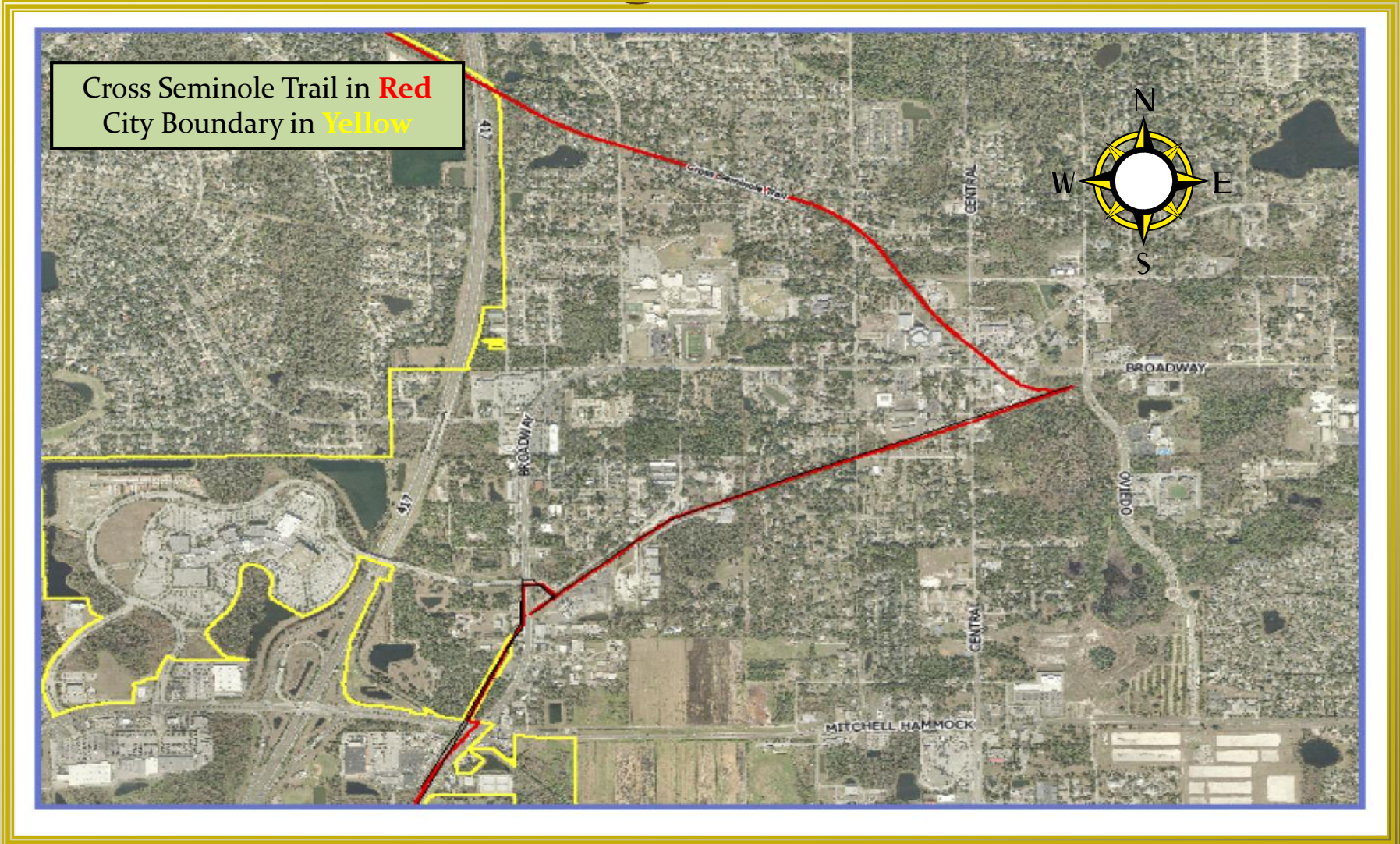
