#### MCKINNEY VENTO ACT-FEDERAL LAW

- Requires educational access, attendance and success for children and youth experiencing homelessness.
- **Provides states with funding** to support local grants and statewide initiatives.

2002 – NCLB Reauthorizes the Title X – McKinney-Vento Act

A homeless family is one who lacks a **fixed**, **regular**, and **adequate** nighttime residence.



<u>Sharing housing</u> due to loss of housing or economic hardship *"doubled-up"* 

- abandoned in hospitals; or
- awaiting foster care placement;





Living in motels, hotels, inadequate trailer homes, campgrounds, shelters due to lack of alternative;

Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations;





<u>Unaccompanied Youth</u> youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian







<u>Migratory children</u> qualify as homeless because of their living situation

## MCKINNEY VENTO ACT-FEDERAL LAW

- Immediate Enrollment
- Right to School of Origin
- **Transportation** to school of origin from temporary residence that is located out of zone
- Free breakfast and lunch
- Cooperation, Coordination, and Collaboration
- Dispute Resolution







2002 – NCLB Reauthorizes the Title X – McKinney-Vento Act
